What is Resilience ?

“An ability to withstand or quickly recover from a difficult situation”

“To assess, prevent, mitigate, respond to and recovery from emerging civil contingency risks”

*The UK Government Resilience Framework,
published December 22*

Biggin Hill Airport multi-agency exercise 08/11/22

- Live testing of Airport Emergency Plans:
 - Collision of two passenger aircraft on the runway
 - Joint operating principles
 - Fire fighting procedures
 - Casualty rescue & treatment
 - Survivor Reception Centre

What if that actually happened ?

- Not at the airport, but elsewhere within the Borough?
- How would partner agencies respond?
- Involvement of this partnership in the management of this incident ?
- What are the subsequent issues likely to occur that will require a partnership response ?

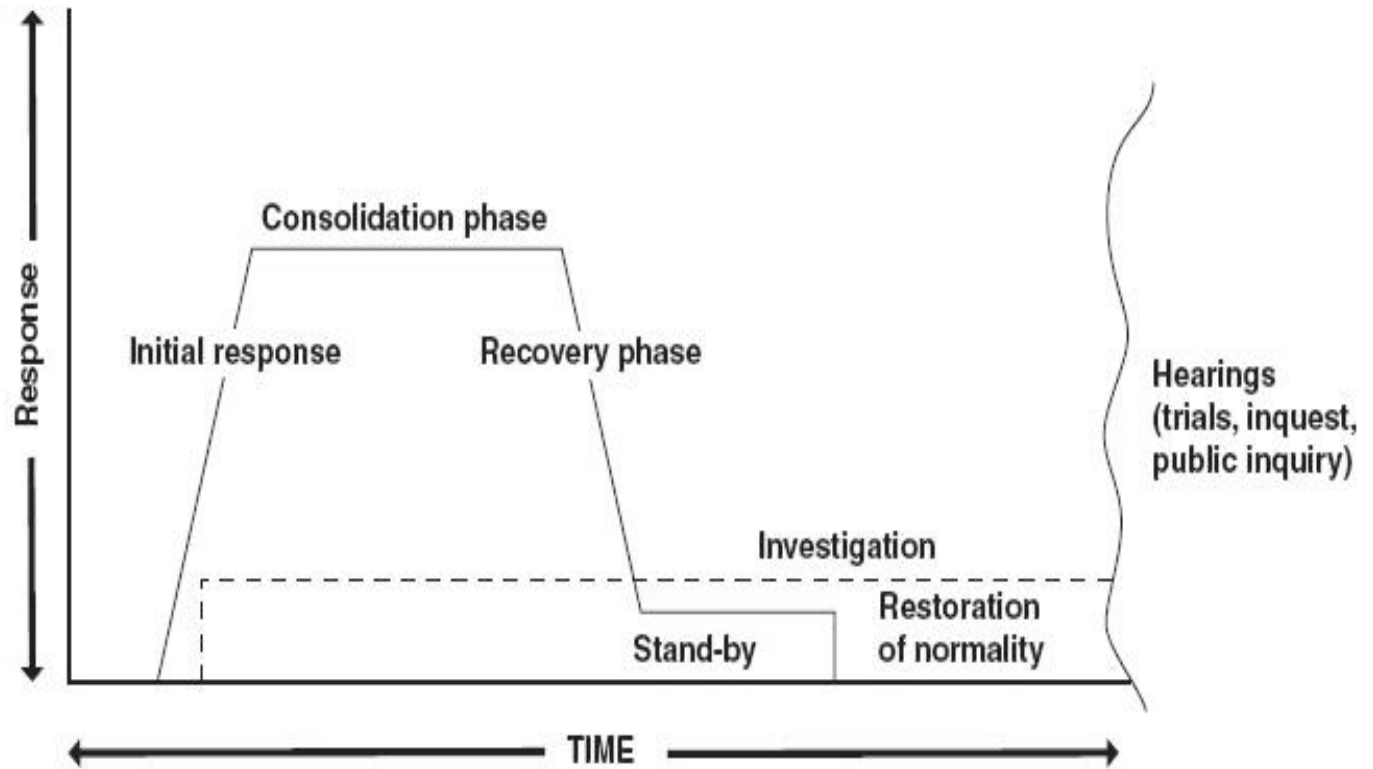


Major Incident Doctrine

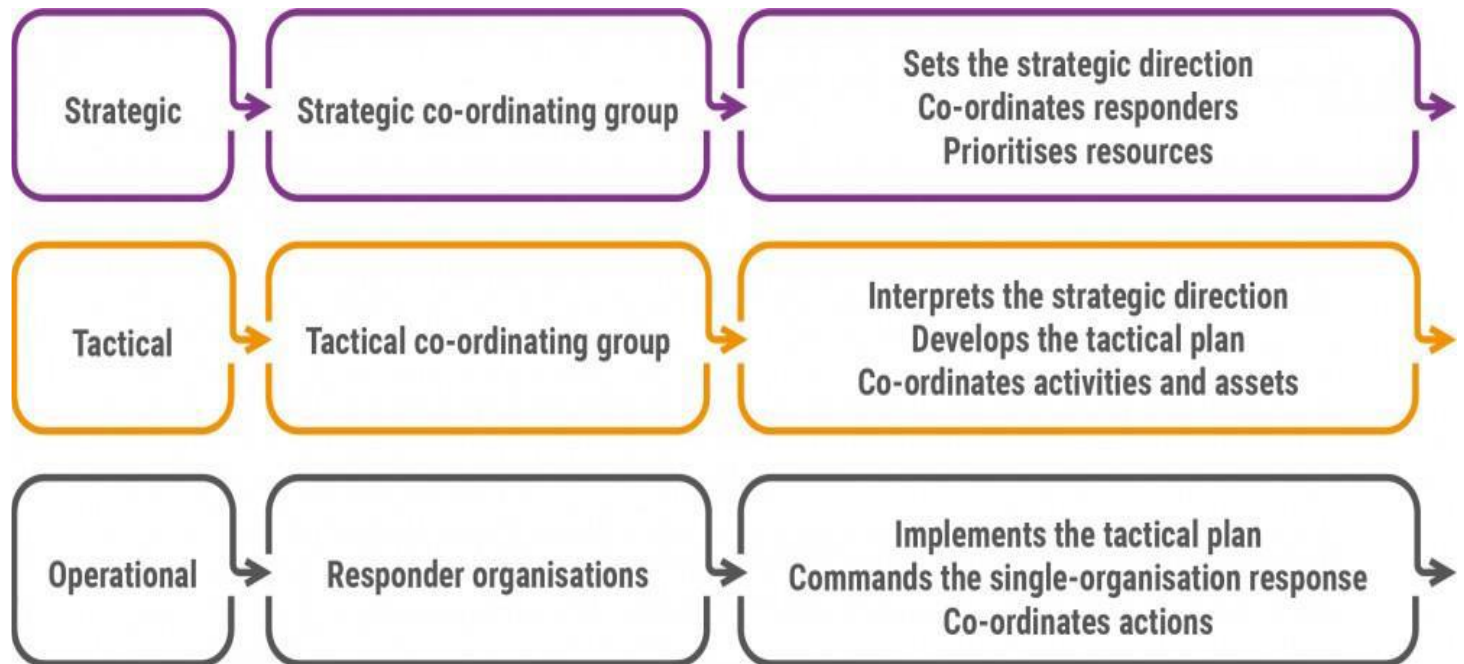
- LESLP manual

An event or situation with a range of serious consequences which requires special arrangements to be implemented by one or more of the emergency responder agencies.”

Stages of a Major Incident



Command Structure



JESIP Principles

Co-locate

Co-locate with commanders as soon as practicably possible at a single, safe and easily identified location near to the scene.

Communicate

Communicate clearly using plain English.

Co-ordinate

Co-ordinate by agreeing the lead service. Identify priorities, resources and capabilities for an effective response, including the timing of further meetings.

Jointly understand risk

Jointly understand risk by sharing information about the likelihood and potential impact of threats and hazards to agree potential control measures.

Shared situation awareness

Shared Situational Awareness established by using METHANE and the Joint Decision Model.
