What is Emergency Essentials?

Background

- Programme went live in June 2018 (now in 5th year of delivery)
- Delivered by <u>Family Fund Business Services</u> and <u>Family Fund</u> on behalf of BBC
 Children in Need
- Annual core funding of £3.2million per year (>£5million in Year 3 2020/21)

BBC CHILDREN IN NEED EMERGENCY ESSENTIALS



What is Emergency Essentials?

- Individual grants programme (direct delivery to the family)
- Supports children & YP facing exceptionally difficult circumstances
- Provides items that meet children's most basic needs, such as a bed to sleep in, or a cooker to provide a hot meal

Grant outcomes aim to improve a child or YP physical or emotional wellbeing reduce parental stress and help to build better family relationships.

Children supported

Of the Grants awarded, the intended outcome of approving the grant were:

42% to keep physically well

15% emotionally well

10%
physically safe and with a strong self belief

Of applications received:

17%

were fleeing or at risk of domestic abuse **39**%

were due to the loss/ breakdown of an essential item/ prevent incurring debt 16%

had been offered adapted/social housing

5,811 additional families helped

FFBS generated £1.7 million additional funds from suppliers, on top of the 3 year funding

Key Information for potential Referrers



Grant applications can only be made online by registered referrers



- Registrations are in an individual employee basis
- Organisations can have as many registered referrers as they wish
- Referrers must have a compliant email address to register (Individual/Organisational email address)

What we **can** help with:

- **✓** Fridge freezers
- ✓ Washing machines
- Children's beds and bedding (including cots)
- ✓ Kitchen equipment and small appliances
- **✓** Furniture
- ☑ Emergency clothing

What we cannot help with*:

- ☑ General subsistence costs, Household bill or debts
- Anything provided under statutory provision
- ▼ Funeral costs
- Items for the sole use of a parent/guardian





EEP Application Process – How does it work?








Post award audit activity: Receipts or copies - nee

- Receipts or copies need to be obtained for all BACS/Voucher awards (showing actual itemised items)
- Confirmation of delivery the audit team may ask you to confirm the items were delivered by our supplier



*Assessment – decisions can take up to 10 days but on average the turn around is 5-7 days

Fulfilment Process



 Kitchen appliances will be delivered and installed directly to the family's home (direct delivery from our national supplier)




- Any kitchen appliances being replaced will be removed at time of delivery (these items should be ready to remove)
- Beds and other household items will be delivered directly to the family's home (direct delivery from our national supplier)
- Referrers cannot request a specific type of item



Access Criteria & Eligibility

- Age: From birth to age 17 and under
- Residency: child or young person is currently be living in the UK



- Other sources of public or statutory funding: The referrer must have explored other public/statutory funding before applying
- **Vulnerability & Crisis**: Child or young person's family are facing exceptionally difficult circumstances or crisis (application tip: focus on the impact of the crisis and vulnerabilities on the child or young person and what will happen if the item is not awarded?)





Emergency Essentials – Application Limits



× Application grant average - grants are awarded in line with the current grant average. Referrers must priorities the need where multiple items are requested.



× 12 month application rule - no further awards can be considered if a family have received an award from the programme in the last 9 to 12 rolling months. Unless, the vulnerability and crisis criteria must have changed since their last application.




Emergency Essentials – Tiered Strategy
