Equipment Demonstrations

Bromley deafPLUS provides equipment assessments and demonstrations for Deaf and Hard of Hearing people in conjunction with the Bromley Equipment Officer who does home visits. The type of equipment the charity demonstrate includes:

- TV loop systems
- Alerting devices
- Personal listening devices
- Telephone amplifiers

Social Groups

Bromley deafPLUS run a variety of social groups including:

<u>Hard of Hearing Group</u> – this group meets twice monthly for tea or coffee and cake and a chat. Once a month there is a guest speaker. The team have been visiting the members of the group, at a socially safe distance. Below are some testimonials from some of the members of the group:

<u>Tinnitus Support Group</u> – this group meets every 3 months. A guest speaker is at each meeting where people can ask questions. Tinnitus can be very upsetting and distressing. As part of this group, you feel that you are not alone and other people can understand what you are going though.

<u>BSL practice Group</u> – a group to practice your British Sign Language skills. This group is currently online via Zoom and has really taken off. Members are from as far away as Plymouth and Bristol!

NHS Hearing Aid Batteries

Bromley deafPLUS provide NHS hearing aid batteries to anyone living in Kent. Pop in to the office to pick up your supply. Bromley deafPlus also run a Retubing and Maintenance Clinic in conjunction with Hi Kent once a month.
